

Library Resources

We will be highlighting scholarly sources, library guides, databases, and digital primary source materials that serve our community. To access library resources off-campus, please use <u>VPN</u> (Virtual Private Network).

Central Asia, Persia and Afghanistan, 1834-1922

Explores the history of Persia (Iran), Central Asia, & Afghanistan from the decline of the Silk Road in the first half of the 19th century to the establishment of Soviet rule over parts of the region in the early 1920s. This resource comprises correspondence, intelligence reports, agents' diaries, minutes, maps, newspaper excerpts & other materials from the FO 65, FO 106, FO 371, & FO 539 series at the UK National Archives.

India, Raj and Empire

First-hand accounts from journals & diaries document the East India Company's foundation & India's independence. The resource consists of the manuscript collections of the National Library of Scotland relating to South Asian history between 1615 - 1947. It covers material on India, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Afghanistan, Malaysia, & Singapore. Resources include diaries, journals, private & official papers, letters, sketches, paintings & other original documents related to Indian history & literature. Sources include the East India Company, government documents & papers of British military officers & civil servants in India.

Early Arabic Printed Books from the British Library

A full-text searchable database of early printed books in Arabic script. Covering religious literature, law, sciences, medicine, geography, travel, history, & literature. It includes books of European/Arabic translations. [1475-1900]. The databases consist of 3 modules: (1) Religion & Law; (2) Sciences, History, & Geography; (3) Periodicals, Literature, Grammar, Language, Catalogues & General Works. Search in Arabic or Roman scripts.
